PERINI NAVI SEVEN

192 feet (58.6m)

This aluminum sailing ketch is the third hull in the 60-meter series that the Perini Navi design team created in collaboration with Ron Holland Design. Italian architect Michela Reverberi, working with Perini for the first time, was responsible for interior design. The yacht has two aluminum Panamax masts with carbon fiber rigging, booms and spreaders. perininavi.it

SANLORENZO SEVEN SINS

170 feet, 7 inches (52m)

Seven Sins is Sanlorenzo's largest steel-hull yacht to date, the first 52Steel. She has six guest staterooms plus crew quarters for 10. Her after section has terraces that open at the water level, creating a beach club illuminated via the transparent bottom of an aft deck swimming pool. The terrace area can also become

a floodable garage for tender stowage. Sanlorenzo also will display its 460EXP, SL118 and SD126. sanlorenzoyacht.com

TANKOA VERTIGE

164 feet (49.9m)

Vertige, a full-displacement aluminum motoryacht, has six guest staterooms, sole-to-ceiling windows, foldout hydraulic terraces in the owner's suite and a transom beach club. A gym and cinema are on the upper deck. Exterior styling is by Francesco Paszkowski Design, and the interior is by Paszkowski in cooperation with Margherita Casprini. tankoa.it

TANSU CYCLONE

141 feet, 4 inches (43.7m)

Built in Turkey with naval architecture by Diana Yacht Design and interior and exterior by Tansu, this semi-displacement trideck motoryacht is built of wood and epoxy with a teak deck. She accommodates eight guests in four staterooms. *rizatansu.com*



TURQUOISE RAZAN

154 feet, 3 inches (47m)

Turquoise Yachts acquired a steel hull and a semi-completed superstructure from an Italian shipyard and, with the help of H2 Design, transformed it into this yacht. She has cantilevered decks that create a floating appearance. *Razan* was built with an extended family in mind: Communal and separate spaces include a sundeck, spa pool, cinema and beach club. *turquoiseyachts.com* M
